

# PHD IN GLOBAL HEALTH METRICS & IMPLEMENTATION SCIENCE

The PhD in Global Health Metrics and Implementation Science Health is the first of its kind, building on the expertise of our faculty in metrics and implementation science. This program provides students with the latest and most innovative tools to advance health solutions that are critical for decision-making and priority setting. Metrics students receive advanced training in scientific measurements to accelerate progress on global health by identifying the world's major health problems, assessing how well society addresses these problems, and guiding resource allocation to maximize health improvements. Implementation science students focus on the systematic application of scientific approaches to ask and answer questions about how to accelerate the translation of evidence on intervention efficacy to implementation and broad scale-up with greater speed, efficiency, quality, and coverage.

#### **APPLICANT QUALIFICATIONS**

This program attracts highly qualified national and international students who wish to pursue a longterm career in global health. Applicants may enter the program with a Bachelor's degree and a minimum two years of experience within the field of health or quantitative disciplines. It is highly desirable that applicants have prior Master-level training or have significant experience working in the global health field, ideally in a low resource setting.

#### **ADMISSIONS\***

All application materials are submitted through the UW Graduate School's online application.

Applicants submit a Statement of Purpose, GRE (General Test) scores, three recommendation letters, transcripts, and a resume or CV. International applicants may also need to submit TOEFL scores.
